55 countries across Africa, Asia, the Pacific & Latin America

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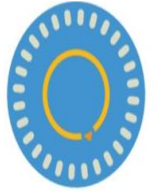
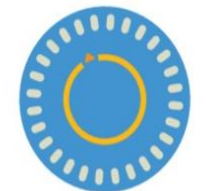
## HOW

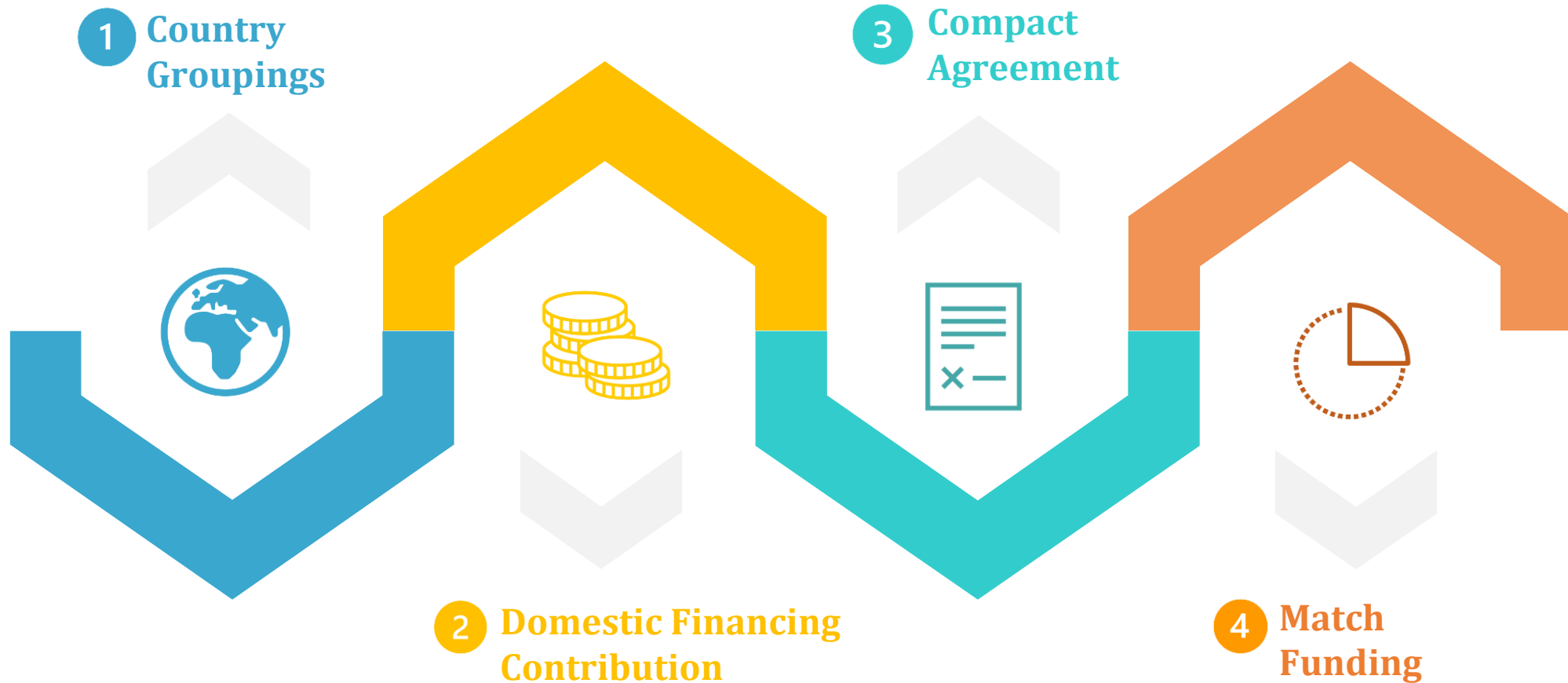

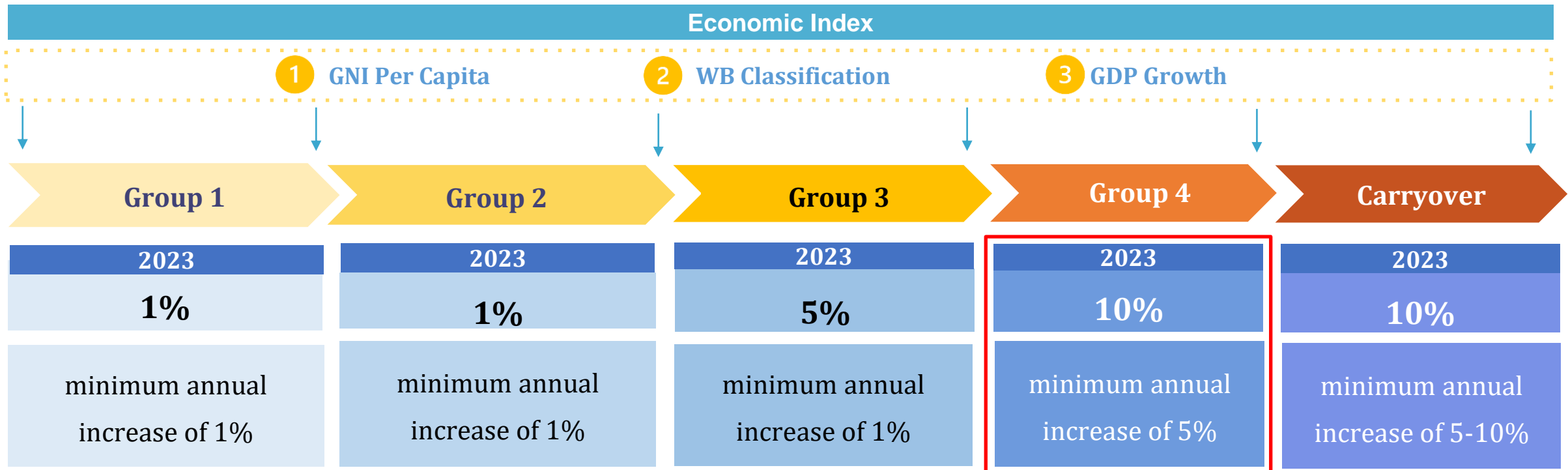

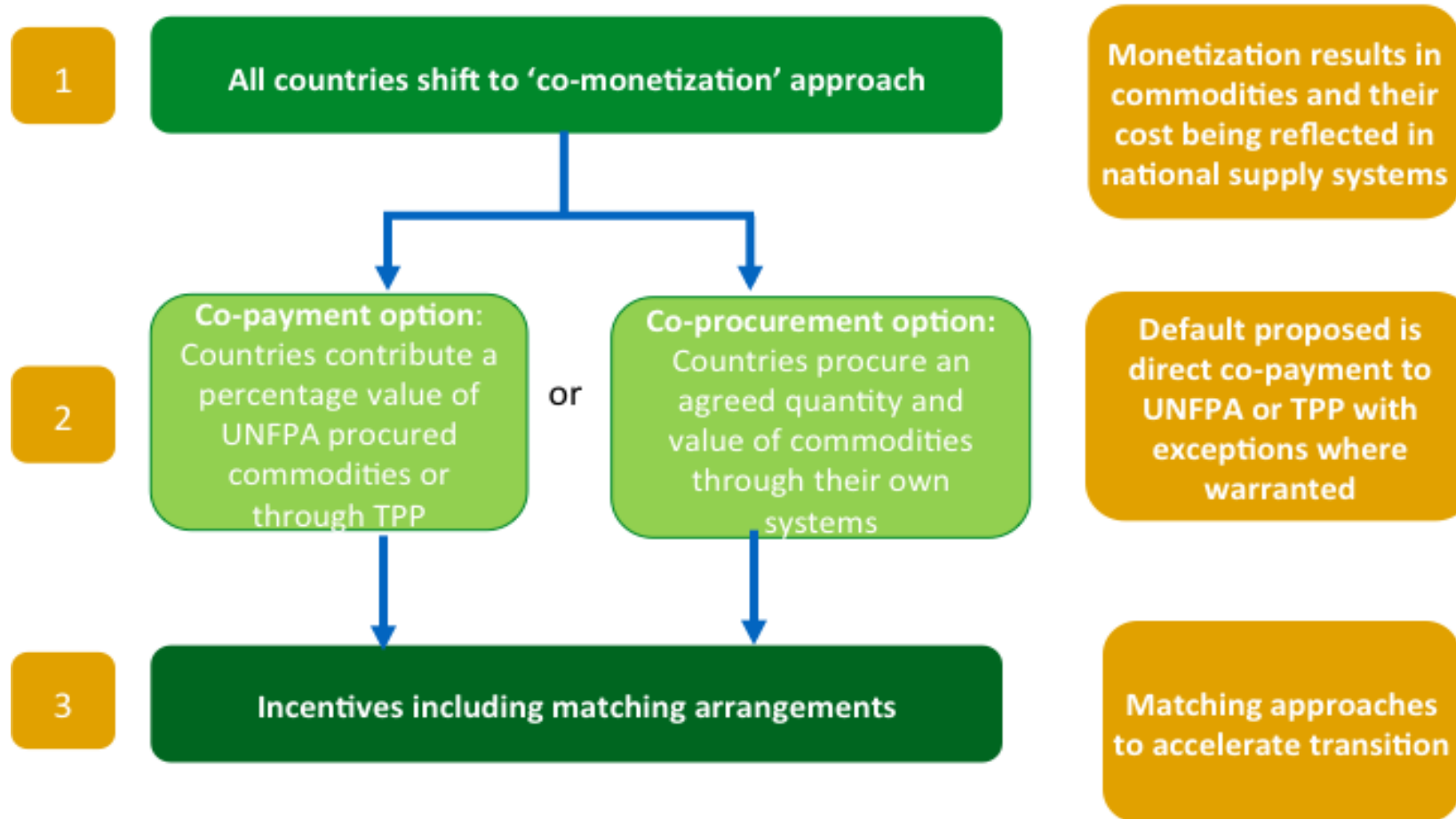

# SHIFT - DONOR HANDOVER TO CO-MONETIZATION APPROACH





The Compact is an agreement among partners that must be **signed in all Partnership countries** by 2022, effective 2023.



# Matching Fund & Domestic Financing

- ❑ In 2023: govt contribute a **minimum of 10%** towards the cost of UNFPA Supplies commodities ie US\$150,000
- ❑ In 2023: Govt can receive up to US\$1,500,000 in a 1:2 ratio matching funding from UNFPA; .
- ❑ In 2024: Govt contribution – 15% ; No matching fund yet
- ❑ In 2025: Govt contribution – 20%; No matching fund yet

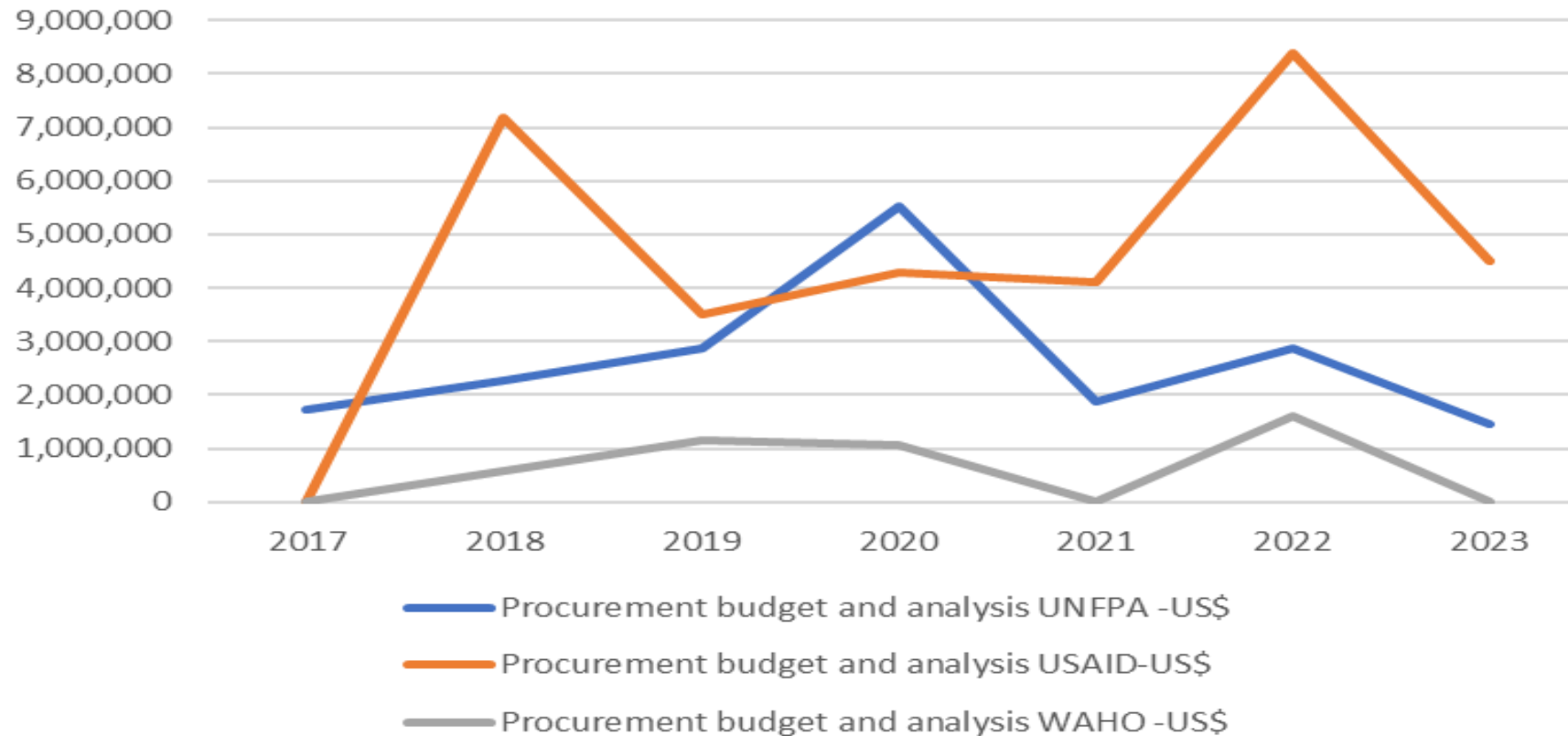

# Country efforts towards sustainability

- Support to MoH to strengthen Private Health Sector Desk
  - (Private Health Sector Summit, corporate sector strategy, etc)
- Co-financing strategies  
UNFPA - Compact partnerships
- Family Planning services under NHIS
- Advocacy for Private Sector involvement in FP – Private Health Insurance, manufacturers/suppliers (efforts of TFHO, UNFPA, SFH, USAID)
- Capacity building in forecasting methodologies /tools for gaps to inform advocacy
- Advocacy for creation of FP budget line in national budget

# SOME CHALLENGES



- Constricted fiscal space – globally, nationally, IMF bail out, competing needs in other sectors
- Information - Actual Expenditure on FP procurement hard to obtain
