

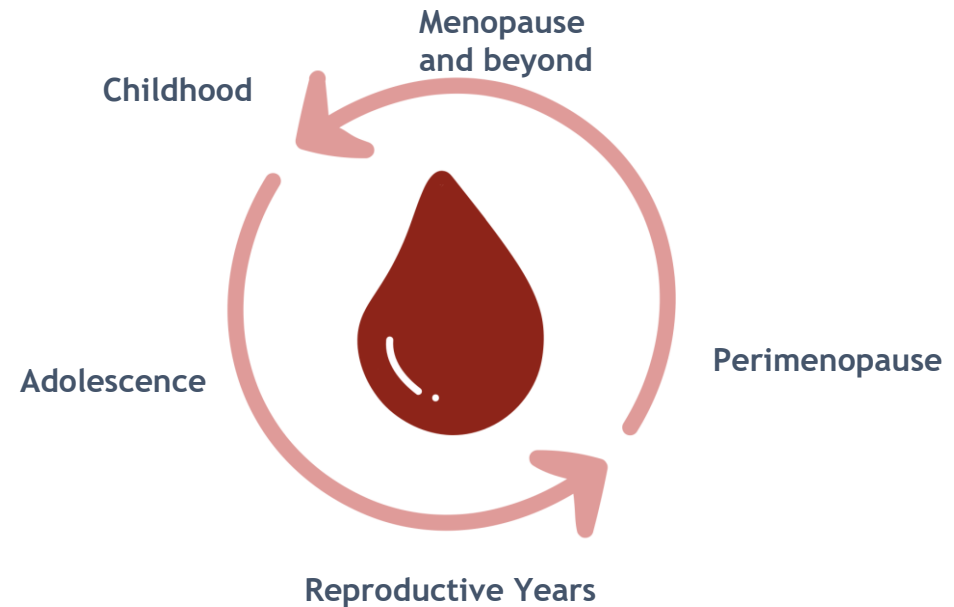

Gender and menstrual health

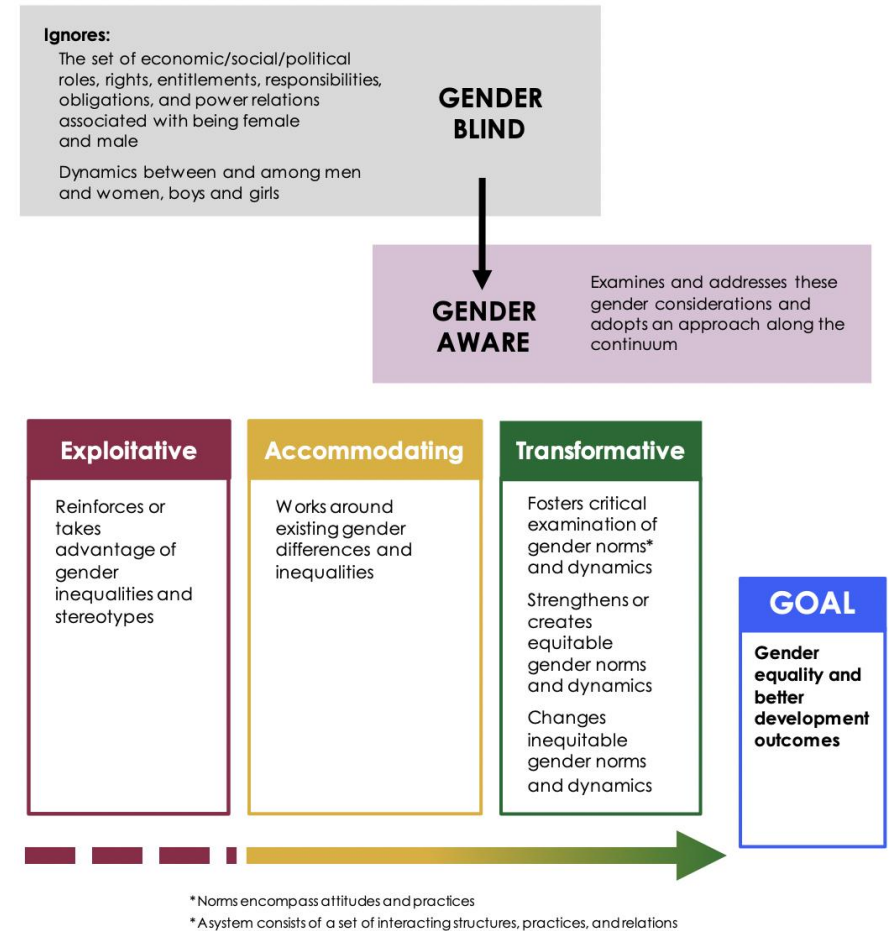
- Gender power structures limit the ability and agency of all girls, women and people who menstruate to negotiate for and access

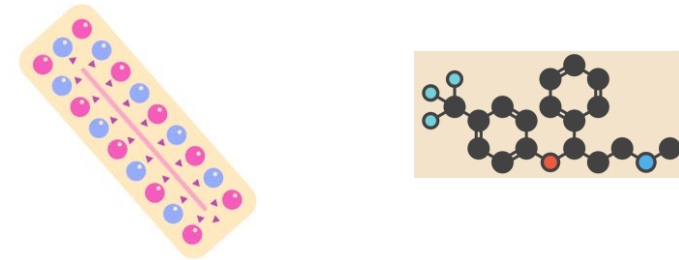
1. Addressing prevalent gender-exploitative norms
